ARTIFICIAL HEART BEATS.

Hamburg Doctor Demonstrates Feasibility of Taking Organ from Body with Safety.

That the heart of a cold-blooded animal, after the death of the animal, may be contracted by electricity or other irritant, is a fact which is well known to the ordinary person. But that it is possible to take the human heart out of the body and keep it in activity for hours is a fact which has just been demonstrated by Dr. Deneke of Hamburg.

The experiment was performed by Drs. Deneke and Adam on a woman who had been executed by the guillotine in Hamburg, the criminal being 48 years of age and in good health. The head fell into a closed sack, into which also passed the greater portion of the blood from the carotid arteries, and from this sack there was obtained about 1 1/4 liters of blood, which was at once deprived of its fiber. At 8:12 a. m. the body was taken into a cell of the prison, stripped, and the thorax opened; there were still evident weak contractions of the single portions of the heart, the movements of the auricles being tolerably regular, while the contraction of the left ventricle was hardly distinguishable.

After the regular beating of the heart had continued for some time a little air balloon was passed into the pulmonary veins in the left auricle, and then through the mitral valves into the left ventricle. Two hours after the execution the heart commenced to palpitate, apparently in consequence of the rise in temperature and the pressure used to force the blood through the organ.
