TRADE FOLLOWS FLAG.

New German Steamship Line to the Gulf of Persia.

Consul-General Pitcairn writes from Hamburg that the proposed new line of steamships of the Hamburg-American Company between European ports and ports of the Gulf of Persia promises favorable results, particularly in connection with the Bagdad Railway.

The maritime trade with Persia has for years been controlled by British shipowners, by means of pool arrangements, and sailings were restricted according to the demand, and freight rates increased arbitrarily.

The exports from Germany to the Gulf of Persia have steadily increased in recent years. The chief articles of exportation to Persia are sugar, cotton and half-silk goods, dyestuffs, copper and iron goods, drugs and chemicals, whereas principally wool, galls, gum, tragacanth and Arabic, dates, mother-of-pearl shells, sheep and goat skins, boxwood, sesame and other seeds are exported from Persia.

Work of Methodist Conference.

The St. Louis Globe-Democrat says the Birmingham Conference will be remembered in the annals of the period. It certainly will be, for it dealt with great subjects, and at all points the Church South has been found to be progressive and free from an iron dogmatism.

This was shown in the resolutions adopted looking to a closer union between the Church South and the Northern Church. The Conference refused to take any steps looking to organic union, but it did not hesitate to endorse all propositions that would eliminate uncalled for antagonisms and that would carry out the federation already agreed upon.

The Church South also goes on record as favoring a revision of the doctrinal faith of world-wide methodism; or, at least, taking up the question of revision. The Conference that has just adjourned, started a movement that may yet go on until it is felt in every part of the civilized world.

Scarcely less important was the work done in relation to Vanderbilt University. Heretofore that great school has asserted independent control, and it had taken steps to secure a new charter on independent lines.

The battle was fought in the committee of education, and not on the floor of the Conference, but it was a battle—an important battle—nevertheless. Hereafter Vanderbilt University will be a Church institution owned and controlled by the Southern Church.

Action on these three matters fully justify the St. Louis Globe-Democrat in declaring the Birmingham Conference one of the most notable that has been held since the split occurred in Methodism in 1844.
