Mr. Bryan's position was: "I have already reached the conclusion that railroads partake se much of the nature of a monopoly that they must ultimately become public property and be managed by public officials in the interest of the whole community, in ac cordance with the well-defined theory that public ownership is necessary where competition is impossible. I do not know that the country is ready for this change. I do not know that a majority of my own party favor it, but I believe that an increasing number of the members of all parties see in public ownership the sure remedy for discriminations between persons and places and for the extortionate rates for the carrying of freight and passengers.

Believing, however, that the operation of all the railroad by the Federal government would result in a centralization which would all but obliterate State lines, I prefer to see only the trunk lines operated by the Federal government and the local lines by the several State governments.

"Some have opposed this dual ownership as impracticable, but investigation in Europe has convinced L . that it is entirely practicable."


