William Jennings Bryan, who spent several months traveling in different countries, returned home the other day and was hailed in the big style that men of his caliber should be.

Mr. Bryan's position was: "I have already reached the conclusion that railroads partake so much of the nature of a monopoly that they must ultimately become public property and be managed by public officials in the interest of the whole community, in accordance with the well-defined theory that public ownership is necessary where competition is impossible."

Believing, however, that the operation of all the railroad by the Federal government would result in a centralization which would all but obliterate State lines, I prefer to see only the trunk lines operated by the Federal government and the local lines by the several State governments.

"Some have opposed this dual ownership as impracticable, but investigation in Europe has convinced me that it is entirely practicable."

At the meeting of the board of county commissioners and the county board of education held Monday, Mr. R. C. Lawrence brought before the board the question of the employment of a surveyor to make a complete county map, showing the location of the several townships, school districts, public roads, school houses, churches, grist mills, streams, bridges, etc.—in fine, a complete county map.

J. B. Carlyle, Engineer McLendon Dead. Salisbury Dispatch, Aug 21st.

Engineer McLendon, who was shot by someone in the assembly the night of the recent lynching here, yesterday took an operation for the purpose of saving his life, but despite this he died this morning at 4 o'clock.

The ball took effect in his leg and since the night of the occurrence there has hardly been any hope for him.

What part he was playing will probably never be known, nor who shot him.

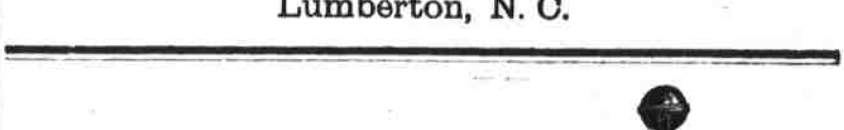
