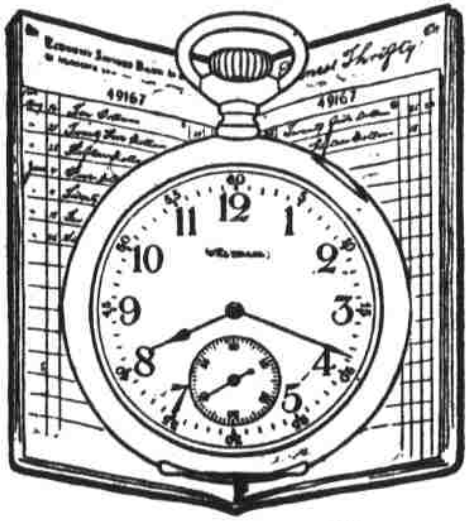

COMMISSIONERS ON ROADS.

Jurors Drawn for Next Term of Court

The commissioners in session Monday passed the following orders:

Ordered that the following public road, in Thompson township, petitioned for by H. M. Norment and others commencing at H. M. Norment's and running straight by way of John Bridgers and Elrod and ending at the McNair graveyard connecting with the Lowrie road, be granted in accordance with prayer of petitioners and that same to be laid out and opened up by the Superintendent of the roads.

On motion it was ordered that the hearing of F. R. Prevatt; et al and J. L. Prevatt, et al be heard at next meeting of the board.

Ordered that petition for road signed by H. McMillan and N. B. Brown, et al be granted.

Ordered that Polly A. Matthews be allowed \$2 per month and entered on regular list.

On motion the petition for public road signed by D. S. Knapp, F. A. White and others, same road passing through lands of J. C. McPhail, D. S. Knapp and others, be not granted.

Ordered that petition public road signed by J. F. McPhail, et al be filed.

Petition filed for public road from Wade Warwick and others. Notice be sent.

Ordered that bill \$36.51 be paid to J. N. Regan. Charge to general fund for lumber on Big Swamp Bridge.

Supt. Jones report read and filed.

On motion it was ordered that the resignation of J. W. Wilkes be accepted to take effect October 15th and he be notified.

On motion it was ordered that J. M. McBride be appointed to succeed J. W. McBride as supervisor of Blue Springs township to take effect as soon as the bond be accepted.

Ordered that Mr. Eli Phillips be and is appointed supervisor of Lumberton township to succeed Gus Prevatt, resigned.

Road report submitted by several townships, excepting Smiths and Lumber Bride, be accepted.

Ordered that A. Odom be advised that petition for new road

from St. Pauls to Rennert be signed by land owners and returned so board can take action on same.

Ordered that bill of R. R. Barnes \$13.15 sewer pipes for road be paid and charge to White Bouse road fund.

Ordered that bill of McAllister Hardware Co. \$14.88 for supplies for water works for jail be allowed.

Ordered that bill of D. W. Biggs \$2.56 for freight on truck from Marietta to Lumberton be paid.

Ordered that bill of J. M. Deese \$46.50, for putting water supplies in jail, be paid.

Scotch Dinner in 17th Century. Scotch Review.

An account of hospitality in 1629 gives a good idea of the manner in which a country gentleman of the period lived. Dinner and supper were brought in by the servants with their hats on, a custom which is corroborated by Fynes Moryson, who says that, being at a knight's house who had many servants to attend him, they brought in the meats with their heads covered with blue caps. After washing their hands in a basin they sat down to dinner, and Sir James Pringle said grace. The viands seemed to have been plentiful and excellent, "big pottage, long kale, bowe of white kale," which is white cabbage; "brech sopps," powdered beef, roast and boiled mutton, a vension pie in form of an egg, goose. Then they had cheese cut and uncut, and apples. But the close of the feast was the curious thing about it.

The tablecloth was removed, and on it were put a "towel the whole breadth of the table and half the length of it, a basin and ewer to wash, then a green carpet laid on, then one cup of beer set on the carpet, then a little long lawn serviter, ploited over the corner of the table, and a glass of hot water set down also on the table; then be there three boys to say grace; the first, the thanksgiving; the second, the paternoster; the third, prayer for a blessing of God's church. The good man of the house, his parents, kinsfolk and the whole company they then to drink hot waters, so at supper, then to bed, the collation which (is) a stoupe of ale."
