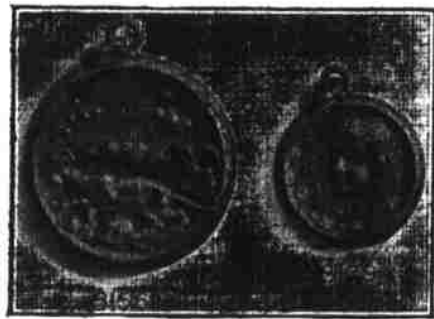

COMMISSIONERS MEET.

New Members and County Officers Give Bond and Take Oath of Office—Claims Passed.

The board of county commission was in regular session Monday to transact the county's business. Messrs. A. L. Bullock and D. S. Alderman, the new members of the board, sat in judgment for the first time. The new board was organized by the re-election of Mr. J. W. Carter chairman and Mr. E. J. Britt attorney for the board at a salary of \$200 per annum. The other newly elected county officers qualified for their offices.

Wrong Influences, at Home.

Lula Taylor, the young girl who has been much in the public eye here recently on account of her arrest and detention on advices from Fayetteville, was last night by Judge Jones given the privilege of returning to her mother in Fayetteville or of being paroled in the care of Adjutant and Mrs. Yates of the Salvation Army in this city. She finally decided in favor of the latter course.

The case was brought to Judge Jones on habeas corpus proceedings, instituted by Woodus Kellum, Esq., which asked that the mayor and chief of police be commanded to have her before the court, as the writ alleged that the girl was being illegally and unlawfully held and restrained of her liberty to await an officer from Fayetteville who would take her back for the purpose of forcing her to live at a house which is not a proper one for a girl of her age to live in.

In their answer Mayor Waddell and Chief Williams averred that they were holding the girl on request from the authorities at Fayetteville to await the arrival of an officer from that town, as a minor who had run away from home.

In the habeas corpus proceedings, Judge Jones had Lula Taylor and a man named Williams, who the girl says she was to marry, sworn and examined and other testimony was also taken.

After hearing all the evidence Judge Jones gave the girl the choice of one of two courses and her decision is stated above.

CIRCUS TRAIN WRECKED.

One Showman Killed and Two Injured—Spark's Outfit Comes to Grief—Injured Showman Beat Conductor Severely and Took to the Woods.

High Point, Dec. 3.—The train hauling John H. Spark's circus, was wrecked this morning at Roberdel, a small station on the Aberdeen & Asheboro Railroad, 20 miles below Troy. One showman was killed and two were badly injured as a result of the smash-up.

The causes of the wreck are unknown. Several of the cars were badly damaged and two horses and a pony were badly mangled.

The blame for the accident was evidently placed upon the conductor of the train by the showmen. Immediately after the wreck several of them, infuriated by the death of their companions, turned upon Conductor Slack and beat him into insensibility. After taking their spite out on him they escaped into the surrounding timber and have not been seen since.

Immediately upon the arrival of the Asheboro train at this place with the news of the wreck and the assault upon Conductor Slack the sheriffs were in a posse and started for the scene. Every effort is being made to capture the guilty parties.
