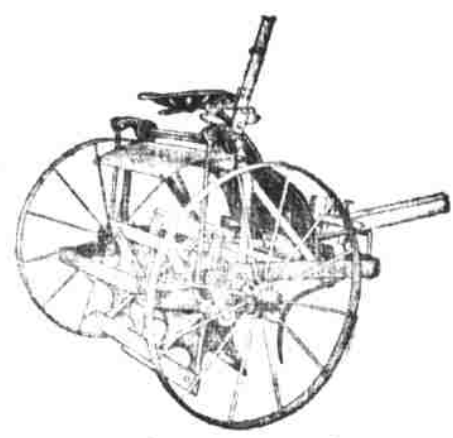

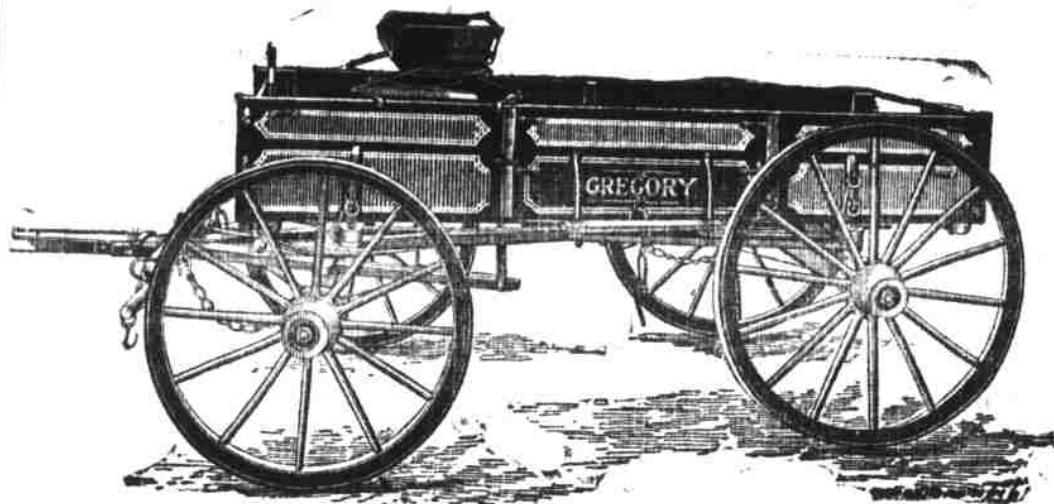

Growth of Town Revelation.

The Correspondent spent part of 2 days in Lumberton recently, and the growth of the town is a revelation. A man going there today, after an absence of 10 years, would simply fail to know the place as Lumberton—until his eyes fell on the ugly old court house. Main street, built up with handsome new business blocks, and well paved, would do credit to a city of 15,000 or 20,000 inhabitants. There are 2 banks, both in elegant quarters, 2 very prosperous cotton mills, and a cotton oil mill doing an immense business. The National Cotton Mills, running 6,240 spindles, have just got to work in a building 24x100 feet, with everything in readiness for an extension. The town owns its waterworks, electric lights and sewerage and is preparing to enlarge the two latter, as well as to extend the system.
