Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

The regular pauper list was allowed.

Ordered that C. T. Elwanger, \$9.52 for lumber for bride be paid from Britts and White House townships' funds.

Ordered that A. C. L. R. R. Co. be allowed rebate of one-half of the S. S. district levied in Rex district Lumber Bridge No. 3.

Ordered that R. D. Lancaster be paid \$74 for self and guard for chain gang for month of February.
