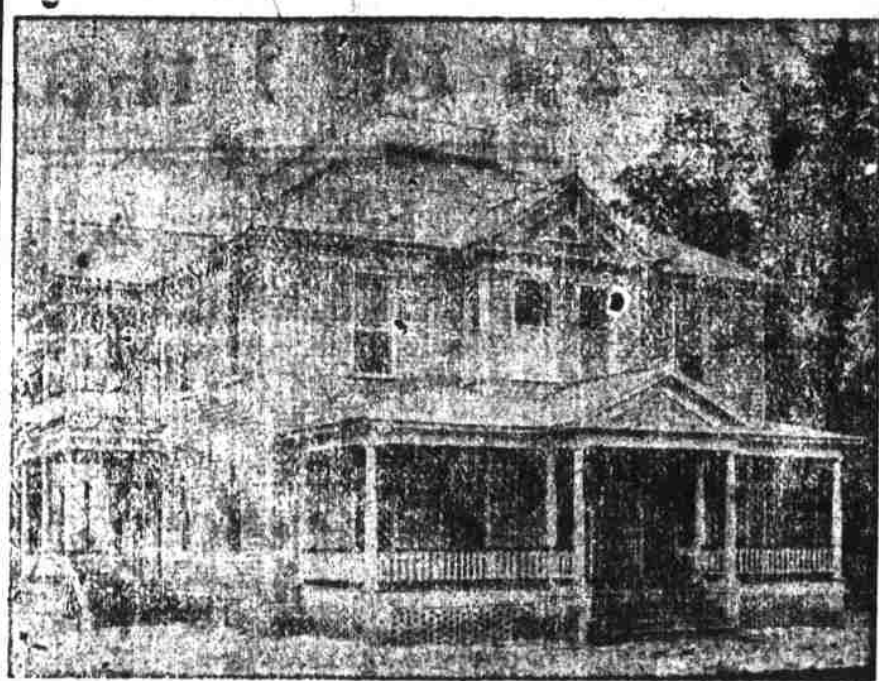

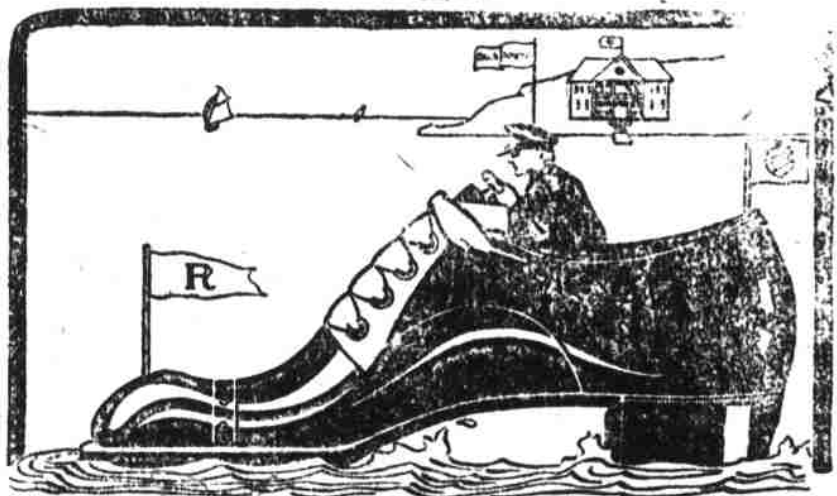

ROAD SUPERVISORS MEET.

Office of Superintendent of Roads Abolished—Bills Approved.

The Board of Road Supervisors met Monday. All the members were present—A. E. White, chairman; H. C. McNair and W. A. Graham.

The office of the county superintendent of roads was abolished and the secretary was instructed to notify the present superintendent to turn over all property belonging to the county to the chairman of the Board of Road Supervisors.

On motion it is ordered by the board that bills for all work done on the public roads of the county must be audited by the board before the treasurer is ordered to pay same.

Bills were approved as follows for road work: W. A. Chason, \$102.25; O. C. Talk, \$8.50; D. T. Rozier, \$17; N. J. McRimmon, \$78.80; McGeachy, Johnson & McEachern, \$38.22; F. C. Jones, \$75; Corney Smith, \$25; Eli Phillips, \$65.58.

W. K. Brock and W. D. Lancaster were elected keepers of the chain gang at \$45 each per month.

Road supervisors we appointed as follows: Back Swamp township, J. K. Singletary; Burnt Swamp, D. A. Brown; Howellsville, Joe N. Regan; Lumber Bridge, D. E. McNair; Maxton, Make L. McRae; Parkton, W. L. Thames; Raft Swamp, R. F. Gregory; Red Springs, D. McC. Smith; St. Pauls, C. W. Jones; Sterlings, B. G. Walters; White House No. 1, W. P. Oliver; White House No. 2, W. C. Brown; Whislarts, J. M. Smith. Appointments were left over until next Monday for Alfordville, Britts, Blue Springs, Lumberton, Saddle Tree, Smiths, and Thompson townships.

Jno. H. McNeill, secretary of the board, was allowed 90 cents for stationery.

It was ordered that the register of deeds be requested to file with the secretary of the board on or before next Monday an abstract showing amount of taxes collected against each township in the county separately for the year 1906.

Mr. Graham McKinnon Resigns as Member Board Education.

The county board of education was in monthly session this week. Mr. Graham McKinnon tendered his resignation as a member of the board, as he had been appointed a member of the County Board of Audit and Finance. Prof. M. Shepherd, of Orrum, was elected to fill Mr. McKinnon's unexpired term as member of the county Board of Education.

Application was made by districts No. 5 Britts township, and No. 1, White House (Fairmont) for election for local tax. The election will be held May 11th.
