

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

The act provides that no domestic life insurance company shall pay any salary or emolument to any officer or person in excess of \$5,000 per annum unless such payment has been authorized by the board of directors. But section 2 causes the most apprehension. It reads as follows.

"No life insurance company which pays a salary or compensation for services or as an emolument or allowance of any kind whatsoever more than \$5,000 per annum to any one person shall be licensed to transact business in the state."

If the section is construed literally, the effect will be to drive from the state every one of the old-line companies. Attorney General Hadley says the section means just just what it says.
