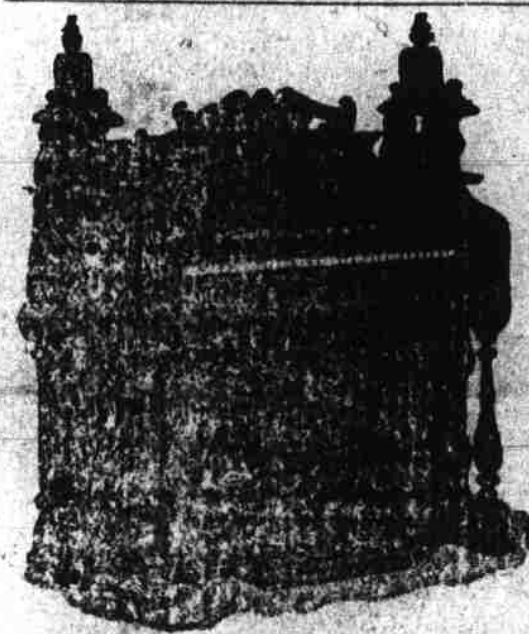

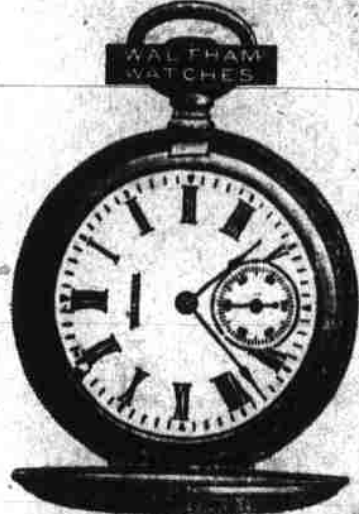

Severe Storm Tuesday.

Severe storms passed over different portions of the county Tuesday afternoon, leaving destruction in their wake. Although, here, nothing was known of the storm, hail and wind played havoc only a few miles away. Much damage was done to the crop of Mr. J. H. McNeill, four miles from here on the Maxton road, also other farms in that section were hurt. In Wisharts township the storm was heavy. Near Orrum, hail and wind were very severe.

A Marriage in the Wee Wee Hours.

Miss Rosa Weinstein, daughter of Mr. S. Weinstein, of Lumberton, and Mr. Sam Dunie, of Wallace, were united in marriage at an early hour this morning. The circumstances surrounding the marriage are as follows:

Several days ago a warrant was sworn out against Mr. Dunie by Mr. Weinstein for seduction. Mr. Dunie was brought to Lumberton last night by Deputy-Sheriff J. H. About 2 o'clock this morning Mr. and Mrs. Dunie and friends repaired to the Jewish synagog, where the marriage was performed according to Jewish rites by Rabbi M. B. Shockett.

This morning at ten o'clock the attorneys for the prosecution appeared before Justice McNeill and announced that the case had been withdrawn.
