The purpose of this paper is to enter a plea for the forderliness and security o our social system." It would perhaps be not unwise for our law-makers to take into consideration the question whether or not the present legal remedies against the encroachment upon family purity are proportionate to the enormity of the offense. In some cases under law, the offender undoubtedly gets his just deserts, and public opinion approves the sentence. Perhaps it might be well if the law of the land prescribed the death penalty for him who invades the sanctity of the home-but it does not. Perhaps it might be well if this concession were made to public opinion. Such a compromise would give no recognition to the unwritten law, but might go far toward removing the cause for its operation. 


