Robeson county Superior Court for the trial of civil cases got down to work Monday, Judge E. B. Jones, of Winston-Salem, presiding. Mr. James Plummer Wiggins, of Rowland, exhibited license, took oath and was admitted to the bar.

The case of O. M. Britt vs. the Carolina Northern Railway Co. was taken up Monday afternoon and is on trial now. The trial will probably be concluded today. This is a suit for the recovery of \$25,000 damages from the C. N. Railway Co for injuries sustained while loading logs. This is the second trial of this case, a new trial having been granted by the Supreme Court.

LUMBERTON GRADED SCHOOLS.

The Enrollment Has Already Surpassed Expectations—All Who Fail to Enter During First Month Will be Placed in Lower Grade Than If They Enter Now—Pupils Who Do Not Enter Until Spring Term Will be Year Behind—Work Progressing Finely—Present Conditions in the Different Grades.

The enrollment in Lumberton graded schools has already surpassed the number expected by the superintendent or the committee. Most of the grades are now crowded, but accommodations will be provided in some way for all who may come.

Prof. Sentelle announces that all who fail to enter school during the first month will be placed in a lower grade than if they enter now. Parents are urged to send their children at once if they expect them to enter at all during this school year. Pupils who enter during the spring term will be one year behind the pupils who enter now. This plan will not be deviated from, no matter who may be involved.

The work in all the grades is progressing finely. All teachers have already proven themselves equal in every way to the conditions in their respective rooms, and the disciplinary conditions of the school could not be better. The work of grading pupils is about complete, and regular class work will be carried out from this time forward.

The following facts present the conditions that exist today in the several rooms: First grade, 39 pupils, Miss Mary Watson, teacher; second grade, 35 pupils, Miss Pennie Rowland, teacher; third grade, 44 pupils, Miss Agnes McBrayer, teacher; fourth grade, 33 pupils, Miss Sallie McLean, teacher; fifth grade, 23 pupils, Miss Nettie Beverly, teacher; sixth and seventh grades, 45 pupils, Miss Mamie Avert, teacher; eighth and ninth grades, 57 pupils, Miss Leila May Gill, teacher.

The music department, under management of Miss Polly Crowder, has an enrollment of 25 pupils.

Public School Examinations—Meeting of Teachers Association.

Regular public examinations for public school teachers will be held in Lumberton in the office of Superintendent Poole on the 10th, 11th and 12th of this month—on Thursday, the 10th, for white teachers; on Friday, the 11th, for colored; and on Saturday, 12th, for Croatans. Those who desire to stand examinations will do well to bear in mind the fact that the superintendent is not required by law to give private examinations except in instances where teachers are providentially hindered from attending the public examinations. Teachers whose certificates will expire before the end of the school term will be expected to take this examination, as well as those who do not now hold certificates.

The Teachers' Association of Robeson county will meet in Lumberton on Saturday, the 26th. The programme for this meeting will be announced later.
