Was President for a Day.

Many persons have been thrown into confusion by an anxious inquirer who wants to know "what man was President of the United States for one day, and signed one document?" This is not surprising, for the event was one of ante-bellum times and has dropped out of sight in the excitement of the later period. The man referred to was David Rice Atchison, whose name would be almost unknown to the average American of today, but for the fact that it is preserved by the city of Atchison, Kans., which, with the county in which it is situated, was named in his honor.

Atchison was a Kentuckian by birth and a lawyer by profession. He went to Missouri when a young man and rose to some prominence in the law. In 1841 he was appointed to the National Senate to fill a vacancy, on the theory, it was said, that he could easily be displaced by other aspirants, but he was elected for a full term in 1843, and re-elected in 1849. In the Senate he was popular, and was elected President pro tempore for two terms, 1846-1849 and 1852-1854.

During the former term Zachary Taylor was elected President and Millard Fillm ore Vice-President, March 4, 1849, fell on Sunday, and in consequence they were not inaugurated until March 5, and in this interim of one day Atchison was virtually President, as the Constitution makes no provision for the Executive holding over.
