SIZE OF PAPER TO BE CHANGED.

Jury Cases Disposed of Grand Jury's Report.

The term of Superior Court which convened Monday morning, Judge C. C. Lyon, of Elizabethtown, presiding, and Solicitor N. A. Sinclair, of Fayetteville, representing the State, has work on hand to keep it busy for the remainder of the week.

The case against Boss Locklear (as Boss Davis) and William Brooks for the murder of Nolan Bryant at Pembroke on August 1 last, was continued for the defendants. Also the case against Henry Davis, colored, for burglary entering the house of W. D. Dixon, at Pembroke, August 25 last and being shot and wounded by Mr. Dixon was continued on account of the physical condition of the defendant.

The following jury cases have been disposed of: Dave McRae, assault with deadly weapon; guilty; 12 months on roads.

Wm. and Ruth Locklear, fornication and adultery; not guilty. J. R. Robeson, cruelty to animals; not guilty.

Tom Ray, larceny; guilty; 10 months on roads. Ruddle Love, burglary; not guilty.

Simon McNeill, larceny; guilty; 12 months on roads. Evander Drake, carrying concealed weapon; not guilty.

Sandy Baxley, failure to assist officer in making arrest; not guilty. Many cases have been continued for one cause or another, not pros. has been entered as to others, there has been a number of submissions, etc., but lack of space forbids mention of all cases so disposed of.

The grand jury, G. H. Hall, foreman, made its report Wednesday afternoon and was discharged with the thanks of the court. The jury found 44 true bills and 6 not true bills. It advises the moving of the partition in the county treasurer's office to make more room. It recommended that the change in the cells ordered by the county commissioners be attended to at once.

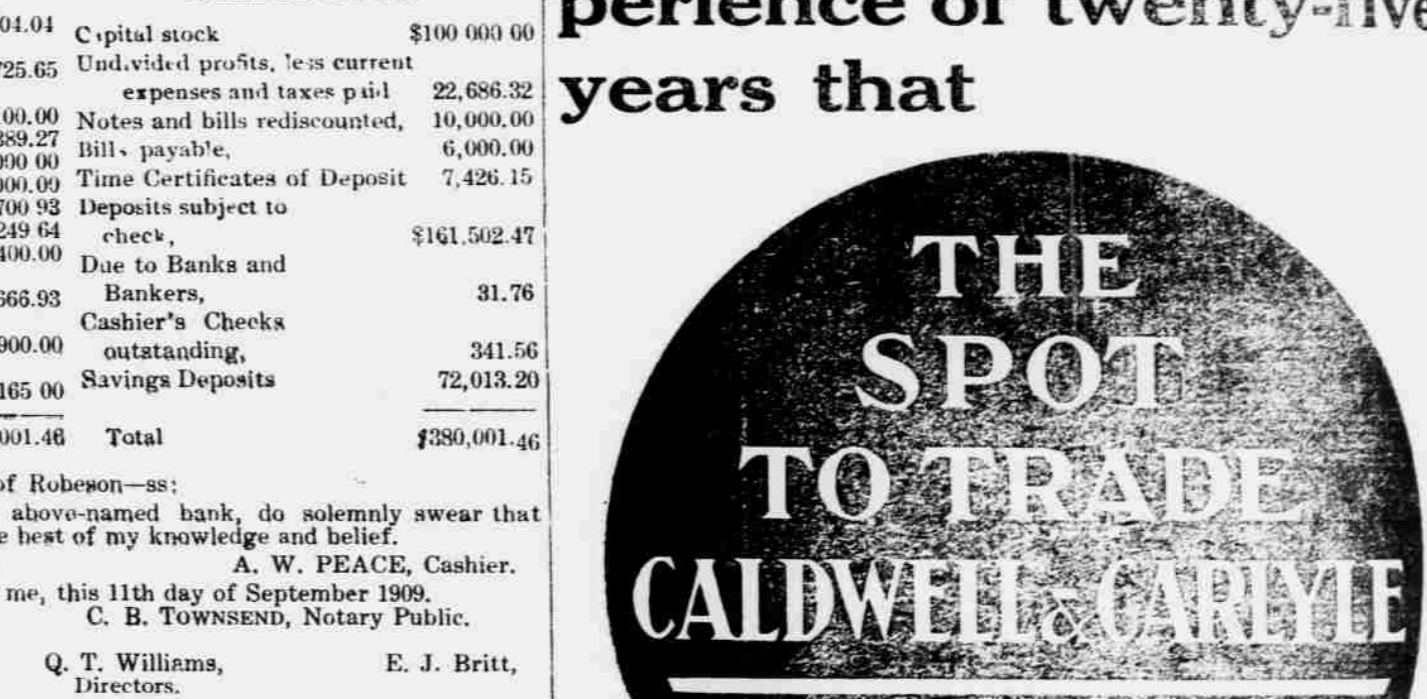
