MR. JUSTICE PECKHAM.

An Associate Justice Of The United States Supreme Court Passes Away.

Rufus W. Peckham, associate justice of the United States Supreme Court, died Sunday night at Coolmore, his summer home at Altamont, Albany county, N. Y. Death was due to a complication of diseases. He had been in ill health for some time but his condition was not considered serious until recently.

Justice Peckham was a Democrat, and before taking a seat on the bench, gave considerable attention to politics in New York. He was born in Albany, N. Y. November 8, 1838, and had been on the bench, State and Federal, for 26 years. He came from the court of appeals of his native State, a position which

his father before him had occupied.

Mr. Peckham's first office was that of district attorney for Albany county. He was elected to that position in 1868. He afterwards became in succession corporation counsel for the city of Albany, member of the Supreme Court of the State and associate justice of the State court of appeals. He was the last of President Cleveland's Democratic appointees to the Federal Supreme Court, Chief Justice Fuller and Justice White being the other two. He took his seat in January, 1896.

There is no rule to govern the appointment of a successor to Justice Peckham, but it is thought that the vacancy on the bench will by precedent likely go to a Democrat. No action in the matter will be taken until after President Taft's return to Washington from his tour through the country.

How The Farmers Can Help.

The cotton manufacturers, who say they will be forced to curtail production until the price of their products advance; that they cannot pay 13 cents for cotton and sell yarn and cloth at present prices, think the farmers can help them and help themselves by buying liberally of cotton goods. The idea seems to be practicable. A curtailment of cotton mill production means a depression in the price of cotton, which is against the farmer. It is presumed that the price of cotton goods is about as low as it is likely to be; that being so it is to the farmer's interest to buy before the price advances. In doing this he will be buying to an advantage and helping to keep up the price of cotton, while at the same time he will be helping

the mill people on whom he is dependent for a market for his product. The farmers may or may not think the mill people always helped them. That has nothing to do with the matter if it is to the farmer's interest to buy liberally of cotton goods now, and in the present instance that appears to be so. The mill people deny that they are trying to depress the price of cotton; they maintain that they want the price maintained but at the same time must sell their goods and get enough for them to meet the prices of cotton if they are to continue in business.
