The New States.

There was no surprise in any quarter when, last month, Congress voted to promote Arizona and New Mexico to the rank of statehood. A dozen years ago they were at the point of admission by virtue of an omnibus bill that would also have admitted Oklahoma and the Indian Territory as two States. A hard fight, led by Senator Beveridge in his capacity as chairman of the Committee on Territories, gave us the present State of Oklahoma, with suitable population and boundaries. Arizona and New Mexico ought to have been united and brought in as one State with a proviso that after fifty years the State might be divided into two if it had population and wealth equal to twice the average of the rest of the States of the Union.

Some business men of Charlotte came grief to recently by putting faith in a kitchen cabinet and buying county rights for selling the contraption at \$200 and \$300 per. It was a "get-rich-quick scheme" that would not work, and when they found out what they were up against they located their man, one A. W. Lincoln, at Gatesburg, Ill., and sent an officer after him; but Lincoln refused to come without requisition papers and had to be released; and then he vanished. And the Charlotte business men who fell victims, and victims elsewhere, are out their money with small chance of satisfaction.
