In response to "Happy Jack's" request, I will tell a few things that I encountered during the three years I served in the war of the sixties. I entered the war in 1861. The first battle I helped to fight was near Goldsboro, led by Capt. Pope, a great and noble leader, who stood by his men in thick and thin. In the first battle at Goldsboro, myself and a friend. 
