GENERAL NEWS ITEMS.

The 8th annual convention of the American Civic Association will be held in Baltimore, Md., Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of this week.

The fourth annual convention of the Southern Appalachian Good Roads Association will be held in Atlanta, Ga., Wednesday and Thursday of this week.

Charles Page Bryan, United States ambassador to Japan, tendered Monday his resignation to President Taft, who reluctantly accepted it. He gave ill health as the cause.

There has been much speculation as to whether President-elect Wilson will call a special session of Congress in order to revise the tariff, but Gov. Wilson has not decided the matter yet.

United States cruisers Tennessee and Montana sailed from Philadelphia Tuesday for Constantinople to protect the lives and property of American citizens in Constantinople, Smyrna, Beirut and other Turkish points.

North and South met and clasped hands over the dead of the Confederacy in Arlington National Cemetery Tuesday when the United Daughters of the Confederacy laid the cornerstone of a great monument to the Confederate dead.

James Bryce, British Ambassador to the United States, has tendered his resignation and will return to England. Desire to devote his time to literary work is the reason of his retirement. He will be succeeded by Sir Cecil Arthur Spring-Rice, now minister at Stockholm.

An agreement between the United States and Russia to take the place of the commercial treaty of 1832, the abrogation of which becomes effective January 1, next, virtually has been reached, according to information from high official authority. It was declared probable that it would be worked out satisfactorily to both countries before the date when the old treaty would expire.
