STATE NEWS.

The Walter George Newman gold mine at Gold Hill are producing gold ore that runs from \$1,000 to \$2,000 per ton and nuggets of gold which have been assayed in New York at from \$100 to \$370 each, is the statement made by Mr. Newman.

The Postoffice Department at Washington has issued orders dismissing Postmaster Basnight, of Newbern. Basnight in addition to charges preferred against him by K. E. Smith, a clerk in the office, is charged with insubordination in that he has positively refused to re-instate Clerk Smith when ordered to do so by the department.

Gastonia dispatch, 6th: Shifful thieves have resold at least ten bales of cotton here in the last week, stealing the staple in the daylight from the city platform. At least this is the only tenable theory, since the cotton could be carried off. The way the trick is worked is, the thief comes at a time when the weigher is operating the scales at the other end of the platform, drives to the other end, takes tags from bales already weighed and sold, loads them on a wagon drives around to the scales, has the bales weighed and tagged again, sample them and makes the sales up town to a broker, who pays once more for cotton already his.

Henry A. Page of Moore county has filed a protest against the appointment of W. C. Hammer as district attorney for the western district. It is understood that nothing is urged against Hammer's character but that incompetence is charged and that the manner of his opposition to appointment of E. L. Auman as postmaster at Ashboro is censured.

Senators Overman and Simmons Saturday recommended to Attorney General McReynolds the appointment of Webb and Dortch as marshals for North Carolina and Hammer and Winston as district attorneys.

Women opposed to equal suffrage had their inning Thursday before the House of Congress, committee chairs. They entered a vigorous protest against the resolution which would create a suffrage standing committee in the House of Representatives. The day before the suffragists appeared favoring such a committee.

A snowstorm which had tied up all forms of business in Denver and Central Colorado ended Friday evening. The total amount of snowfall during the storm was given officially as 45.5 inches.
