First Peace Treaty Based on Bryan's

Washington Dispatch, 18th.

Socretary Brayan and Chevalier van Rappard, Netherlands Minister, today signed a treaty providing that any question between the United States and the Netherlands, which cannot be settled by diplomacy shall be submitted for investigation to an international commission of 5 members. The period of investigation is fixed at one

year although it may be shortened.

The American Netherlands convention embodies generally the principles of Secretary Bryan's plan to bring to an end warfare between the Nations of the world but'it differs in some details from similar acts atree 'y signed. There is no provision in it for the maintenance of the status quo as to military and naval preparations during the period of investigation. Mr. Bryan pointed out today, however, that he considered of the principle of investigation being the keynote of the plan.


