MORE SEED FAKIRS.

A Warning to Farmers—Fakirs Peddling Ordinary Seed Potatoes and Corn at Exorbitant Prices—Beware of Seed Peddlers.

To the Farmers of North Carolina: Sometime ago we notified the farmers of the State that certain seed fakirs were abroad selling various kinds of seeds for exorbitant prices. Notwithstanding some of these fakirs have been arrested they are again at their old tricks of selling seed potatoes for \$6 per bushel that should be worth more than good seed potatoes from the ordinary seed houses. They are also selling corn for \$4 per bushel that is not likely to be better than what you have in your own crib. We warn you again to beware of these seed peddlers and take the matter up with the North Carolina seed laboratory before you are taken in by them. The extravagant claims these fellows are making for their seed potatoes that they are bug-proof cannot be other than false claims to deceive you into buying an ordinary article at a very high price. Therefore, let them severely alone and buy your seed from reputable seed houses that have a license to do business in this State.

Additional Light On Character of Dr. Wooten. Concord Times. Reading Col. Fairbrother's editorial in Everything on the Wooten case at Davidson entitled, "Two Pictures," Rev. Byron Clark, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church at Salisbury, writes the colonel a letter which sheds some additional light on the character of Dr. Wooten. Dr. Clark says: "Though it is not my privilege to know you personally, I wish to thank you for your recent editorial entitled, 'Two Pictures.' Dr. Wooten, who was murdered at Davidson, was a friend of mine, and I had known him from boyhood, and not once had I ever known him to do a mean thing or indulge in a bad habit. He had a habit of visiting his neighbors informally, opening the door without knocking, and asking if supper was ready and saying he had 'come to get something good to eat,' then without sitting down he would go to another home and repeat the informality. The most diligent inquiry, on my part, on the day after the murder, failed to find a man who believed Wooten intended anything immoral in his visit to the home of Jettison. After Wooten was buried many false reports were circulated. '* Of course, it is all over now, and one of the cleanest men I ever knew has gone down under a cloud.' It will be noted that Dr. Clark boldly states that Dr. Wooten was 'murdered.'

The County Commencement. Salisbury Post. C. C. Wright in the Progressive Farmer says that the Farmers' Union can engage in no work that would be productive of greater results in the educational field than the task of interesting people in the county commencement. Having observed the county commencement we believe we can say from this one experience that Mr. Wright is right. The county commencement does good in many ways. It emphasizes in a general way the great question of education. It brings our school interest of the county closer together, it brings about a friendly rivalry, which is conducive of good, spurring the pupils and teachers on to do better work. It focuses attention of the pupils on the rural schools and their needs. It gives the children of the schools opportunity to get a broader and wider vision of life, and it brings together people from all sections of the country in a social way which argues for better social conditions. Our experience with the county commencement last year was perfectly satisfactory, we would say, and the indication are that this year will find the event more interesting and more useful.

An Extension of the Parcel Post that Means Something.

Baltimore Sun. If the parcel post should fail to bring about the establishment on a large scale of the direct dealing between the farmer and the consumer, many of its most enthusiastic supporters would be grievously disappointed. Postmaster-General Burleson's announcement concerning a "farm products post" will be welcomed because it facilitates such direct dealing. Why the "farm to kitchen" business has not expanded, even under the old regulations, it is a little difficult to understand. Certainly there is an opportunity here for householders to reduce the cost of living considerably. Our attention has been called to the case of a Marylander who within a week, on a small shipment of eggs, poultry and oysters from the Eastern Shore, costing him \$3.40, has effected a saving of \$2.00 over the prices charged by his local grocer. That is a mighty big percentage of saving. We are inclined to think from an investigation of this subject, that many consumers have been deterred from establishing profitable relations with farmers in the county by petty annoyances growing out of misunderstandings over time of shipment, the packing of articles and other such things. But those evils are easily remedied. After one or two trials they will straighten themselves out and then both the producer and consumer will profit. There are some individuals to whom the saving effected by this direct dealing is no adequate compensation for the trouble involved in ordering household supplies four or five days ahead of time. There are others, however, to whom the saving means a great deal, and they should take to the parcel post.
