**AN ACT TO PROTECT PRIMARY
 ELECTIONS AND CONVEN-
 TIONS OF POLITICAL PARTIES
 IN THE COUNTY OF ROBESON:**

(Below we are publishing a part of the primary bill which was drawn up by Chairman T. A. McNeill and submitted to the county Democratic Executive Committee at its meeting on the 15th inst. and which was approved by the committee. Candidates for the Legislature will be asked to pledge themselves to have such a measure passed for Robeson county if elected. This is the conclusion of the proposed law, parts of which have been published in the Robesonian of July 20 and 23—Editor.)

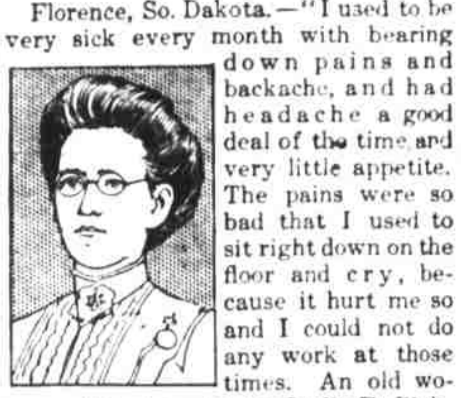
SECTION 19. That the several candidates for office shall, at least 10 days prior to any primary election file with the Clerk of the Superior Court of Robeson county, a notice in writing that he will be a candidate in such primary election; and the office for which he will be a candidate, which notice shall be signed by him, and the clerk shall endorse on the back of each notice the date filed in his office, and shall prescribe the same subject to the inspection of any elector. The chairman of the executive committee of any party, organization or association holding such primary election shall have ballots prepared containing the names of the candidates and the offices for which they are candidates. Each ballot shall be on plain white paper without device. Name of each candidate coming before any primary shall be on the same ballot, and opposite each name shall be a square, and the elector shall make a cross (X) mark in each square opposite the name of the candidate for whom he desires to vote. The name of no candidate shall be placed on the ticket unless a notice has been given in writing as heretofore prescribed, and no ballot other than the one furnished by the chairman of the executive committee as hereinbefore prescribed, shall be voted.

SECTION 20. To provide funds for holding such primary election and paying the expenses thereof, each candidate for a State, Congressional, District, County or Township office, shall at least ten days before such primary election, pay to the chairman of the executive committee of the party, organization or association holding such primary election, such sum as the said chairman, by order of the executive committee of his party shall designate. And unless said sum is paid the said chairman shall not place the name of such candidate on the ticket; provided, that if there is any surplus after paying all the expenses of said primary election said surplus shall be prorated among the candidates. That the said Chairman of the said executive committee shall, not later than sun set of the day preceding such primary election, deliver to the manager or managers of each precinct or polling place three times as many said printed ballots as the registration books, or certified copies thereof, shall show that there are electors in such precinct. And it shall be the duty of said manager or managers to have such ballot or tickets at the polling places at the time designated for holding such primary election. And such manager or managers shall give to each elector presenting himself to vote a ticket, when the said elector shall mark so as to vote for the candidate for whom he desires to vote, and the manager or managers shall not give out said ticket, except to an elector when he presents himself to vote. When requested by an elector, the manager or managers shall assist the elector in marking and preparing his ballot in such way that he shall vote for those for whom he desires to vote. That each elector shall make a cross (X) mark with ink or pencil in the square opposite the names of the candidate or candidates for whom he desires to vote in said primary election, and may fold and deposit his ballot, so marked in the ballot box, or cause the same to be deposited; provided, that if any elector by his ballot votes for more candidates than he is entitled to vote for in said primary election, such ballot shall not be counted, except for those candidates for whom he votes properly; provided further, that if any manager assisting any elector, who cannot read or write, to prepare his ballot, who shall willfully fail to prepare said ballot as directed by elector, he shall be guilty of fraud, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$500 or shall be imprisoned not less than 30 days at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 21. That upon complaint made to the County Board of Election by any candidate or other person of any voting precinct in the county of Robeson of any irregularities of violations of this law or any other election law, the said County Board of Election shall summon before them all such persons as the complainant shall name and designate to testify in regard thereto; provided the person or persons making such complaint shall designate in writing and sign the same the particular act or violation of law complained of, and the said Board of Elections shall take down in writing all of the testimony in regard thereto, and transmit the same to the Solicitor of the Ninth Judicial District, which shall take such action thereon as his duties under the general law requires; provided that any person against whom any breach of the law is charged shall be allowed to be present with his counsel, at least three days notice having been first given said so charged; provided further the cost of such investigation

shall be borne and advanced by the complaining parties, except upon final conviction in the courts, when all of said costs shall be taxed with the court costs against the person or persons convicted; provided further that the solicitor of the Recorder's Court of the Lumberton District and the county attorney shall assist said board of Elections in the investigation herein provided for, which service is hereby made a part of their official duties, and for which they shall receive no additional compensation; provided further the Chairman of said board of elections shall have the right and power to issue all process including subpoenas, necessary to obtain the presence of witnesses, and any person not obeying any process issued by said chairman shall be subject to the same penalties as are enforced by the several courts of the County and State for like offenses. Provided further that if the person or persons making complaint cannot say who or what offenses have been committed, but can produce three members of good standing and character who will certify that according to their best information and belief irregularities and breaches of the law have been committed in the holding of any such primary election, said Board of Elections shall have right to summons before them any person or persons as witnesses or otherwise, and compel them to testify under oath as to anything or facts or circumstances in connection with said primary of which they may have seen or noticed in respect to the improper holding or illegal conduct in connection therewith by any person whatsoever, and if said Board of Elections shall conclude that there were irregularities and have developed such evidence as tends to fix a violation of the law on any person or persons, than such person or persons shall be given a hearing before said board as hereinbefore provided, and the evidence shall be taken and transmitted as hereinbefore provided.

Provided, that any person so subpoenaed or summoned by said chairman shall be required to testify, but such person shall be immune from prosecution and pardoned for every violation of law about which such person is called to testify. Provided further that this section shall not annul or abrogate any general law now in force in regard to elections in this State, primary or otherwise, but shall be constituted only in aid thereof.

SECTION 22. All laws and parts of laws in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 23. That this act shall be in force and effect from and after its ratification.
