COTTON GINNING REPORT

Number of Bales by Counties in North Carolina in 1915 and 1914—Robeson's Estimate 12,860 Bales Less Than Last Year—Total for State 612,848

Sam L. Rogers, Director of the Census, Department of Commerce, announces the preliminary report of cotton ginned by counties in North Carolina, prior to December 1, crops of 1915 and 1914. Robeson leads the State, as usual but the number ginned in the county prior to Dec. 1, 1915, is only 42,776, as compared with 55,636 bales prior to same date last year. The total for the State this year is very little less than the total last year, however, the 1915 crop to Dec. 1 being estimated at 612,848 bales as compared with 674,340 bales prior to same date last year. Yields of counties in this section of the State, also yields of some of the largest cotton-producing counties in other sections of the State, are given below, first figures being for 1915 and second figures being for 1914: Anson, 20,686—20,471; Bladen, 7,188—8,013; Cabarrus, 10,131—10,663; Cleveland, 18,111—19,938; Columbus, 7,104—8,311; Cumberland, 14,682—20,328; Edgecombe, 20,904—18,454; Franklin, 10,490—10,729; Halifax, 21,532—22,543; Harnett, 14,874—20,461; Hoke, 10,385—13,499; Johnston, 31,400—38,330; Lenoir, 10,009—9,060; Mecklenburg, 29,970—19,956; Nash, 19,743—18,971; Northampton, 11,097—13,298; Pitt, 19,718—12,971; Richmond, 12,617—14,461; Sampson, 18,312—20,698; Scotland, 24,504—30,130; Union, 23,107—25,494; Wake, 19,213—22,972; Wayne, 22,917—23,264; Wilcox, 18,532—18,728.

It will be noticed that a few counties raised more cotton this year than last.

GENERAL NEWS ITEMS

North Carolina will not get a military camp. It has been decided that the camp to be established in the South shall be at Fort Oglethorpe, Dodge, Ga.

Representative Kenneth D. Mc Kellar of Memphis, was nominated by Tennessee Democrats at a primary on the 15th to succeed Luke Lea as United States Senator.

At a special election on the 14th Greensboro voted bonds in the sum of \$75,000 for new sewers and \$50,000 for street work.
