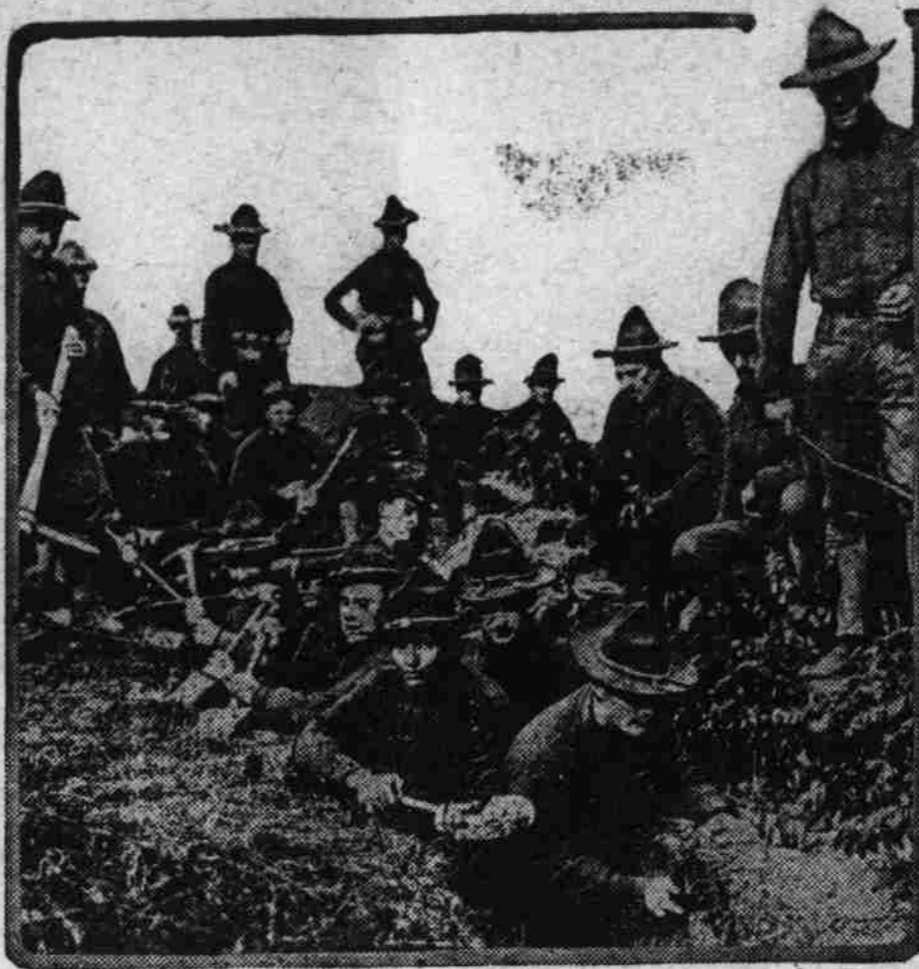

PHYSICIANS MUST REPORT TUBERCULOSIS

Bureau of Tuberculosis Gives Notice to All Delinquent Physicians State Board of Health Bulletin. Raleigh, June 28—The Bureau of Tuberculosis of the State Board of Health is serving notice on all delinquent physicians and heads of institutions for the treatment of diseases according to the law that requires them to report all cases of tuberculosis under their charge to the Bureau of Tuberculosis within seven days after they have recognized the disease.
