JOIN THE RED CROSS.

An Urgent Call to Schools of Robeson County to Become Junior Red Cross Auxiliaries.

National Red Cross headquarters are urging all school children of the United States to wear the Red Cross buttons during the week of the Christmas Red Cross Roll Call. Ten million children in our country are already members of the Junior Red Cross. This shows how Robeson county stands. But can't we put forth extra effort in the next two weeks and have every child in our county enrolled?

The plan is so easy no school can afford not to be enrolled. Then when the boys come back let them see that their schools were behind them. Each school is given an embossed certificate when the organization is perfected.

Daily papers recently published the plan of organizing the schools as given by F. M. Darnall, director of Junior Red Cross of the Southern Division. In substance it ran as follows: Each school raises 25c per capita in any way teachers see fit, but the ideal way is for each child to pay the 25c. However, there are always some who do not do this, and the deficit can be raised by individuals or in any way desired. At any rate, let all the children of Robeson county at least have an opportunity of joining the great band of Juniors.

The Junior Red Cross chairman of each branch should organize every school under its jurisdiction. Interest the teachers and they will organize each school in a few days. Chairmen, teachers, parents, rally to this call and see that your school has the right to raise a Red Cross flag!

Read Wilson's appeal to the children and make Robeson county stand first at least in the State.

Troops Designated for Early Return Home.

Four divisions in their entirety and major units of eight other divisions of the American army in France have been designated by General Pershing for an early return home. These troops, with other special units, General March, chief of staff, announced Saturday, total 3,451 officers and 79,621 men.

The complete divisions which will return at an early date, General March said, are the 39th, 76th, 87th, and 92nd. Important elements of the following divisions to return as soon as transportation facilities are available are the 31st, 34th, 39, 40th, 84th, 85th 86th and 88th.

Repatriated American Prisoners Given Enthusiastic Welcome.

One hundred and fifty-six American officers and non-commissioned officers, the first prisoners of war in Germany to be released through Switzerland, were repatriated Nov. 29 states a dispatch from Berne, Switzerland. The majority had been captured about five months ago. A large number of the men were aviators.

The men rode on a special train with French and British former prisoners. The repatriated men left Bavaria Friday morning and crossed Lake Constance. They were met at Zurich by enthusiastic crowds of Swiss and Americans, some of whom sat up all night to see the former prisoners. The welcome at Berne surpassed almost anything of this kind seen in Switzerland since the war, the dispatch states.
