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E. J. DAVIS & SONS REPORT OF SALES ON FAIRMONT MARKET FOR WEEK ENDING FRIDAY, AUGUST 1ST

Since our last week's report prices have come up by leaps and bounds and fine cutters have sold the highest this week ever in the history of our market.

Our total sales will foot up over one and a quarter million pounds and if we cut out the scrap and sorry low grade sand lugs, our average for the week is around 40 cents. Taking in everything sold will run around 35 cents.

Big curings are selling up to 68 cents, and lots and lots of tobacco are bringing from 50 to 65 cents. It is an interesting sight to see farmers getting checks for single curing from \$500 to \$800.

We are sorry to learn of some of the markets sending out buyers and buying up the fine curings from the farmers at 50 cents and those same curings would bring on the Fairmont market all the way from 55 to 65 cents, and yet claiming to the farmers that they are paying over the market price and are only trading to get the tobacco on their market away from the Fairmont market, while at the same time they know they are swindling the farmer out of say from fifty to one hundred and fifty dollars on each and every curing. We were in hopes that the day of barn door buying by Pin Hookers and warehousemen was over, and sorry to see such methods come back, and trust that since the recent rains have done so much damage to the crops and the farmers losses are so heavy that all warehousemen who are in sympathy with the farmers' best interest, will see to it that such practices are stopped, and let the farmers get what is coming to them.

We will say that any market or set of warehousemen who resort to such practices in order to get tobacco to their market or particular warehouse are nothing more nor less than Pin Hookers, and cannot merit the confidence of the best farmers and business men generally. So we say beware of the barn door buyer, and shun the market that practices such tactics.

Our sales for next week are as follows: Monday, 3rd; Tuesday, 1st; Wednesday, 2nd; Thursday, 3rd; Friday, 1st.

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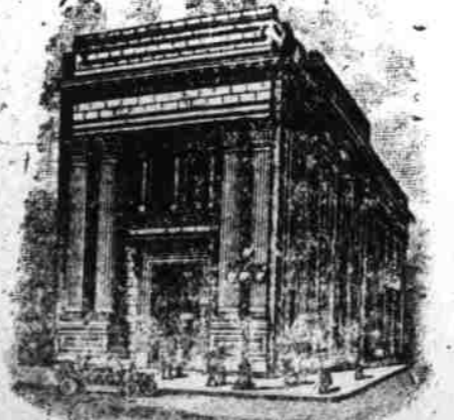


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
