### FALSE TAX FIGURES PUBLISHED BY DIVISIONISTS.

It is astounding that any responsible men would publish such misleading tax figures as divisionist leaders have published. Giving the tax rates for general county purposes of some other counties, they give the rate for the same purposes for Robeson county as 47 1-3 cents.

Elsewhere in this issue The Robesonian gives the correct tax rate for Robeson, which is 19 cents. Any taxpayer can verify this statement by referring to his tax receipt. Moreover, we are publishing affidavits of Register of Deeds M. W. Floyd, who is clerk to the board of county commissioners, and County Auditor J. M. McCallum, to the correctness of this figure.

Floundering still further in the mire divisionists state that since it might be claimed that there was some special reason for this levy, they would give the average for the past five years, and they put Robeson's average at 2803; Cumberland's 2037; Hoke's, 7 years, 2063; Lee's 9 years, 2077; Moore's, 9 years, 1938; Richmond's 9 years, 1770.

Here are indisputable facts, taken from the records of the county commissioners: Robeson's levy for general county purposes in 1910 and 1911, was 20; 1912 and 1913, 18; 1914 to 1917, 19; 1918, 18; 1919, 19; making an average for the past ten years of 18 9-10 cents, lower than any of the counties given by the divisionists as examples with the single exception of Richmond, assuming that the other figures given by the divisionists are correct.

There can be no argument about this. The record speaks for itself.

What are the people to think of such an attempt to deceive them? It staggers comment. This statement of division leaders being so utterly without foundation, so palpably misleading, how can other statements and claims of the division leaders be accepted?

The fates have decreed that Robeson county is not to be carved up into small counties, and some of the division leaders, in desperate efforts to bolster up a lost cause and beat down the groundswell that is on against division, seem to have lost their heads. Surely they would not deliberately try to mislead the people with such false figures.

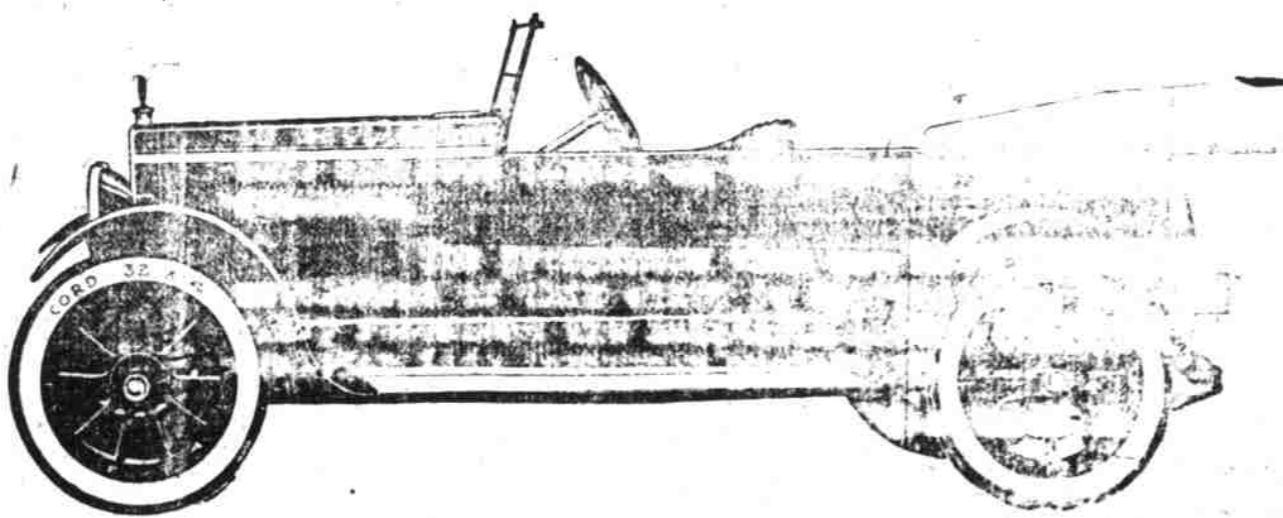

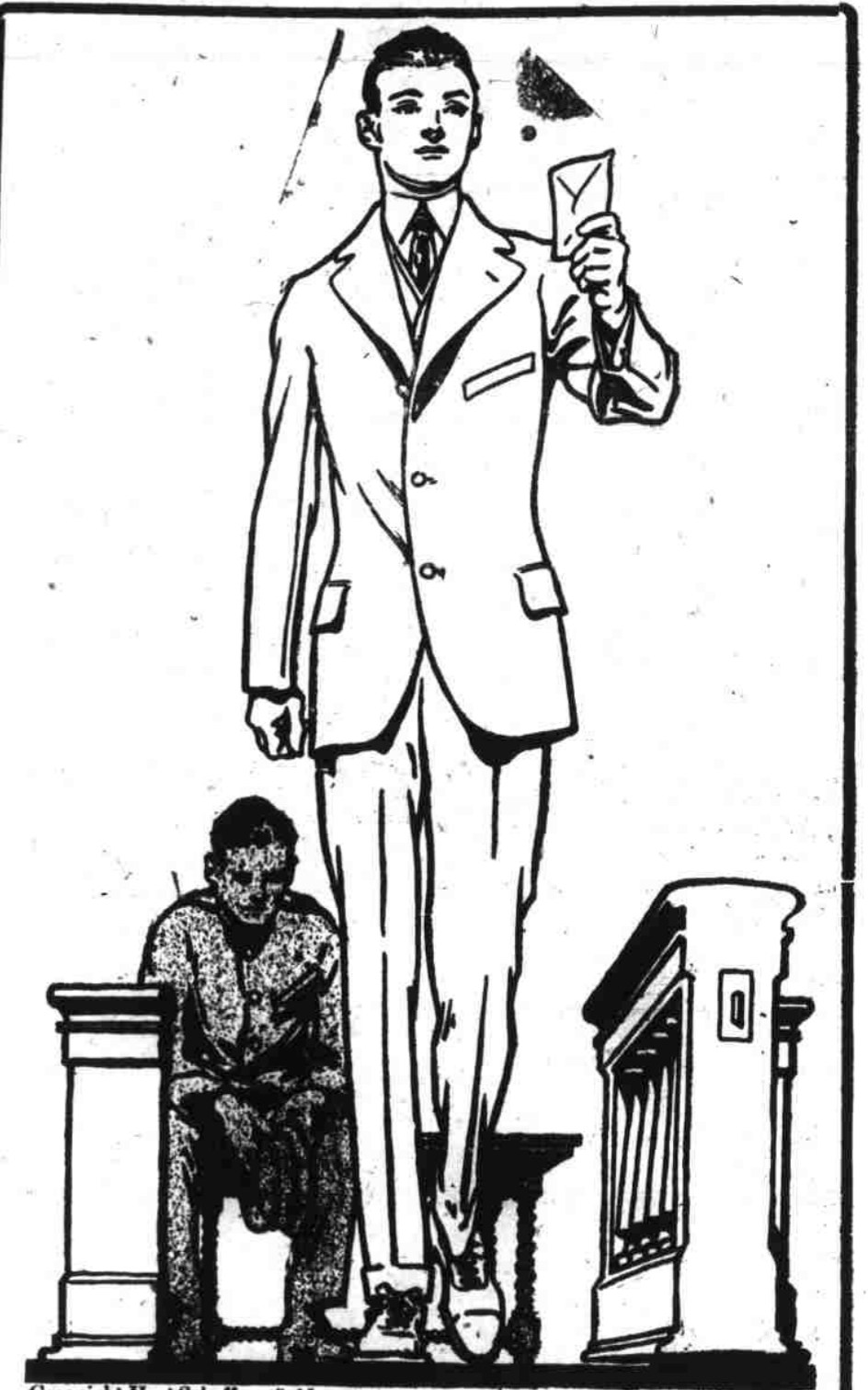
