Poor preparation of the soil was bad for a good start of the young plants.

"The subnormal temperature and four inch shortage of rainfall, as only one inch fell in May, caused the continuance of the late season, warm nights have been lacking. There has been a general cry of the "Worst conditions ever." Very little chop. ping was done at this late date, much seed failed to germinate, and not enough left to replant with. Labor shortag, will prevent recovery of these effects even with favorable con-ditions hereafter. Still the fine rain of the fourth and fifth of June will greatly relieve the situation.

"The last year's 1,490,000 acres picked will be lowered this year as may also be the 266 pounds of lint made per acre. The 1919 crop was itself quite short.

"The fertilizers used under cotton were mostly of the 8-3-3 analysis and reports showed an average of 527 pounds per acre at a cost of \$14.39. The amount and grade of fertilizers increased from western to eastern counties. The Predmont averaged 400 pounds costing \$9.80 while the northern coastal countries averaged 525 pounds at a cost of \$13.20. The central coastal counties showed 611 pounds at \$17.09 and the southern coastal 660 pounds at \$19.60. The top dresser fertilizers will be added later.
