Correspondence of The Robesonian. This season, as all other seasons, carries with it its peculiarities in the line of hard problems to meet. Last per hundred, which was a loss to the ton was 8 and 10c we picked the cotton for 50c per hundred. Indications mark of Bayer Manufacture of Monpoint that this is about as much as oaceticacidester of Salicylicacid. we are going to get for this year's crop of cotton and we consider 50c a fair price for picking cotton and \$3.50 for ginning, bagging and ties is as much as we should have to pay

We strongly advise our brother planters to harvest their cotton as early as is practicable and have same ginned at once as our observation inthe past has been that our peor'e have lost considerable money by deferring action in this matter. This has been a very disappointing season for a number of tobacco planters, but still quite a number of them have realized fine prices where they had good grades of tobacco. We think our planters should continue to plant a reasonable amount of tobacco and strive to make the better grade And for the coming year we would advise our planters to get the very best variety of seed and have better plant beds and be able to transplant earlier than in the past, as the early plants have been the most successful for the past three years.

We planters should do more thinking and planning to be able to combat the boll weevil pest that seems 'to be coming to us. We ask that our brother planters exchange views with the planters through these columns and thereby give each other the benefit of their experience.
