TO COTTON PLANTERS

This season, as all other seasons, carries with it its peculiarities in the line of hard problems to meet. Last season's cotton was picked at \$1.50 per hundred, which was a loss to the producer. In former years when cotton was 8 and 10c we picked the cotton for 50c per hundred. Indications point that this is about as much as we are going to get for this year's crop of cotton and we consider 50c a fair price for picking cotton and \$3.50 for ginning, bagging and ties is as much as we should have to pay this year.

We strongly advise our brother planters to harvest their cotton as early as is practicable and have same ginned at once as our observation in the past has been that our people have lost considerable money by deferring action in this matter. This has been a very disappointing season for a number of tobacco planters, but still quite a number of them have realized fine prices where they had good grades of tobacco. We think our planters should continue to plant a reasonable amount of tobacco and strive to make the better grade. And for the coming year we would advise our planters to get the very best variety of seed and have better plant beds and be able to transplant earlier than in the past, as the early plants have been the most successful for the past three years.

We planters should do more thinking and planning to be able to combat the boll weevil pest that seems to be coming to us. We ask that our brother planters exchange views with the planters through these columns and thereby give each other the benefit of their experience.

A squad composed of the following: A medical examiner, A compensation and insurance expert from the bureau, A Federal Board representative, A Red Cross representative, An American Legion representative, will visit Lumberton on November 7, 8, and 9, for the purpose of cleaning up all unfinished compensation claims, making physical examinations and sending ex-service men to hospitals when necessary, get vocational training for them if they are eligible under the law, etc. Anything you want to know and have not ascertained about your case, bring it to the Red Cross office in the municipal building, Lumberton, N. C., November 7th, 8th, and 9th.

This squad is sent out by the bureau of War Risk Insurance, Washington, D. C., and is working in each community it visits in conjunction with the local Red Cross and American Legion post. The Red Cross representative at Lumberton will be glad to have you send him a statement of your case before the above dates so the matter may be attended to with the least delay after the squad arrives.
