A Great Swing Back To Democracy

Democratic Chairman Hall Expresses Satisfaction Over Results of Election

Washington.—Satisfaction was expressed by Cordell Hull, chairman of the Democratic national committee, in a statement issued Wednesday night on the results of last Tuesday's elections.

"In the name of the Democratic national committee," he said, "I congratulate the loyal Democrats and the independent men and women of both parties, men of legitimate business, farmers, working men, ex-service men and everyday citizens victimized by the Republican administration through false promises and non-performance who made possible the splendid victory of Tuesday last."

A large share of the credit is due to the press of the country, Democratic and independent, and the leading Republican papers which abandoned partisanship for the material and moral interests of their readers, a public service and a political service which I gratefully acknowledge and of which I am highly appreciative.

"The extent of the victory in the election of Democratic Governors in Republican States and the Senatorial candidates is known. The returns on the House of Representatives have been slow in coming in and are indecisive, so much so that at this time it cannot be said with certainty which party has carried the house. The indications are that the house will be close. Whether it is Democratic or Republican it is a Democratic victory and a Republican defeat because in the event of Republican success the margin will be so close that the progressive and radical element will hold the balance of power and the Republicans, therefore, will not control the house. The same is already true of the newly elected senate."

"The great swing back to democracy removes any pretext for discussing a third party movement so far as the Democratic party is concerned. The Democratic party can be relied upon to apply a sound principle and policies of government to every day conditions and in so doing to enact all sound and progressive ideas as it did after it came into power in 1913.

It is the only party that offers to every class of persons and to every section of the country a complete national program of sound and wholesome principles and policies."

Overcrowded: Our school is so overcrowded that we feel that it is time some steps should be taken to relieve the congestion. The first grade is so large that an additional teacher will have to be employed and the additional section placed in a room in the old house on the school property now being occupied by Mrs. Reynolds. At the present time the senior class is having to occupy the auditorium as a classroom. This is a very poor arrangement but is the best that can be had under the conditions as they exist. Our laboratory is so small and crowded with equipment that only a very small class can be accommodated and that makes for extra work for all of us.

We do not know what will be done with the extra section to come to the high school next year from the seventh grade. It seems that there will be no place at all for them unless we have another building. What we really need is a building large enough to take care of a very large high school and one that is equipped to do the best work. Why not be thinking along this line and let us get some definite action in a short while? The school is as large as, or larger than, the buildings were originally designed for and it seems that it is time to do something or else give up hopes of having a larger and better arranged and equipped school.

England Refuses to Purchase Peace With Turks. London.—Great Britain refuses to purchase peace with the Turks at the cost of "humiliation and disgrace," Marquis Curzon, British secretary for foreign affairs, declared Wednesday in an address at the Cannon street hotel.

The attitude of the Kemalists, reflected in their recent demand that the allied troops leave Constantinople, will not be tolerated, he added, and he gave flat warning to the nationalists that they will come to sure disaster if they venture to oppose their military power "to the strength of Great Britain and the might of Europe."

The gravity of the situation in the near east was emphasized by Lord Curzon when he termed it "the most definite menace to the peace of the world."

MEDIUM STEERS PROFITABLE: De Kalb County (Ill.) Farmer is of Opinion That Grade Stuff is Superior. The prime feeder steer, so often cited as the best beef-making machine, is sometimes a less profitable animal, according to a De Kalb county (Ill.) cattle feeder, than the steer of poorer quality. This man has had experience with both kinds and regularly feeds eight to ten carcasses a year. The prime steer undoubtedly will produce a somewhat better killer than the poorer quality animal, but it is his belief that the difference in price is less on the finished animals than it is on the feeders. The kind of steers he now buys it has been possible to purchase as feeders at about 1 cent less than the price of the best ones. When finished and put on the market these steers ordinarily have sold about half a cent lower than others of the other quality. He figures that his cost of gain is about the same as that of the other. Thus there is an advantage of one-half cent a pound in feeding this second-grade stuff instead of the very best.
