

At Eastern Carolina Exposition Cotton Co-operatives Will Have Exhibit to Aid Cotton Growers.

Raleigh, April 5-Farmers who visit the Eastern Carolina exposition at Kinston April 8, 9 and 10 will find a most interesting and educational ex-hibit among a number of others. The North Carolina Cotton Growers' Cooperative association has arranged a booth which is to be not only a display that will interest but is planned to aid the cotton growers of the counties which take part in the exposition.


