CHIEF JUSTICE CLARK.

The life and works of Chief Justice Walter Clark, who fell on sleep at his home in Raleigh yesterday, afford a striking example of what a man can accomplish if work is his passion and pastime. He kept everlastingly at it. He was often startlingly radical in his views for a judge, but he at least had the courage of his convictions and never hesitated to express his views. He was a lieutenant colonel in the Confederate armies at the age of 17, the youngest man to attain that high rank in either the Northern or the Southern armies, and he was realous in preserving the history of North Carolina's part in the struggle between the North and the South. He was admitted to the bar in 1868, when he was 22 years old, was elected Superior court judge in 1885 became a justice of the Supreme court in 1889, and served as chief justice since 1903. In editorial review of his life the Wilmington Star says:

"During the last 25 years, though a very busy man on the state and supreme benches, Judge Clark labored incessantly as a student and author, having produced legal and historic work which have given him a national reputation. During his vacations he did his studying and writing at his farm in Halifax county. He annotated the 'Code of Civil Procedure', which reached its third edition and made him known as a jurist in every state of the union. Among his other literary and legal work, he campiled and edited 'North Carolina State Records' (16 volumes), published between 1894 and 1897, was the author of five volumes of Histories of North Carolina Regiments in the Civil War', and his immense labors NOTICE OF DISSOLUTION, included reprints of all North Carelina Supreme Court Decisions with rical subjects.
