Exp. 1.—Four dogs were severally
made to swallow two parts, long and
narrow, of pork, mutton, veal and

Exp. 2.—Four dogs were made
severally to swallow the same portions
of the same meats, and were killed in

Exp. 3.—Four dogs had the same
quantities, and were killed in three
hours. The pork had lost 93, the

Exp. 4.—Four dogs had the same
quantities, and were killed in four
hours. The pork was whisly digested,

Exp. 5.—Four dogs were severally
made to swallow two parts, long and
narrow, of beef, rabbit, cod-fish, and

Exp. 6.—Six dogs were severally
made to swallow 100 parts of muscle,
skin, gristle, sinew, bone, and fat.
