2d. That the Board of Commissioners shall, semi-annually, appoint one of its own members, to take the rounds of their respective wards...

3d. It is further ordained, that any inhabitant duly appointed, who shall refuse or neglect to perform the duties of Inspector, shall forfeit and pay a fine of \$10.

4th. Whenever any person is notified by the Inspectors of the existence of a nuisance on his or her premises, such person shall forthwith remove or abate the same...

5th. The Commissioner who may be one of the Inspectors of the Wards, shall appoint the time when the inspection shall take place in his ward.
