



LAW OF THE U STATES Passed at the first Session of the Twenty-Second Congress.

AN ACT making appropriations for the support of Government for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums be, and the same are hereby, appropriated, to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, viz:

For the mileage of the members of Congress and delegates, four hundred and ninety-three thousand eight hundred dollars. For pay of the officers and clerks of both Houses, thirty-four thousand four hundred dollars.

For the Library of Congress, five thousand dollars; and also for repairs and furniture for the Library of Congress three thousand dollars, to be expended under the direction of the Library Committee.

For alterations and repairs of the Capitol five hundred dollars. For improving the grounds, including the gardener's salary, two thousand dollars.

For compensation of the President and Vice President of the United States, the Secretary of the State, the Secretary of the Treasury, the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Navy, and the Postmaster General, sixty thousand dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of State, nineteen thousand four hundred dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Treasury, fifteen thousand four hundred dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of War, three thousand five hundred dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Navy, eleven thousand two hundred and fifty dollars. For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Postmaster General, five thousand dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Interior, five thousand dollars. For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the District of Columbia, five thousand dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Florida Territory, three hundred and fifty dollars. For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Michigan Territory, seven thousand eight hundred dollars.

For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Arkansas Territory, three hundred and fifty dollars. For compensation to the clerks and messengers in the office of the Secretary of the Louisiana Territory, five thousand dollars.
