

AN ACT to authorize the Governor of the Territory of Arkansas to cell the land gran-ded to said Territory by an act of Congress approved the filteenth of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty two, and for other

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That whenever the Gov. troor of the Territory of Arkansas shall furnish to the Secretary of the Treasury, a sufficient description of The boundaries of the thousand acres of land, granted by an act of Congress of the fiteenth of June, one thousand zight hundred and thirty-two, to the Territory of Arkansas, for the erection of a Court House and Juli in the town of Little Rick, in the Territory afores id, it shall be the duty of the Becretary of the Treasury to cause a patent to be issued for said thousand acres of land, to the Governor of Ar Inisas, and his successors in offic-In clast, for the benefit of the Terri With of Arkansas, for the purpose of erecting . con thouse and jail at L t-He Rack.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted. That the Governor of the said Terrifory of Arkausas be, and he is hereby fully empowered and authorized to lay if into town lots, conforming as Bear as practicable, to the present plan of the town of Little Rock, so much of said grant of a thousand acres of land as he may deem advisable so to be appropriated ; and that he be furthey authorized to sell the same, from time to time, as the public interest may require : and the residue of baid grant, which may not be laid off Lito Lign lots corresponding with the Plan of the said town of Little Rock. he shall be authorized to dispose of, in such lots or parcels as he may deem advisable ; but in no case shall. he be authorized to sell, unless he shill give public notice of such sale, by an advertisement in one or more hewspapers printed in the Territory of Arkansas, and said sale shall be pub-Little Rock.
