RAISING IRISH POTATOES.—Mr. David McLain, of this city gives us the following statement of Irish potatoes raised by him in the garden of Dr. A. Long the present year. On 1/2 square rods, 6 1/2 bushels, equal to 53 1/2 per acre. On 1/4 square rods, 15 bushels, equal to 380 to the acre.

The potatoes were of the Early Goodrich and Early Rose varieties, and were awarded a premium at the Salisbury Fair.

The Raleigh Carolinian says upwards of 80 arrests in Lincoln county are reported by U. S. officers, about 35 of whom are retained under bonds for their appearance at the next term of the Federal Court in this city.

CARPET BOGGERS IN FLORIDA!

Recent investigations, says the Boston Post, instituted by a convention of tax-payers in Florida, reveal a sad condition of financial affairs in that State. So desperate are the circumstances, indeed, that something like proceedings in bankruptcy or temporary liquidation, at least, is suggested as the only practical measure of relief.

The debt of the State is found to have been increased in three years from about half a million to five and a half millions of dollars, by the recklessness and incompetency with which the public affairs have been managed by the present administration, and the corrupt extravagance of expenditure in which the Carpet Bagger adventurers who have ruled the State have indulged. On a taxable property of thirty-five million, and that a very arbitrary and over-estimated valuation, a tax has been levied for the current year of half a million of dollars, which is about five dollars a head for the entire population of the State; and they are the only portion of the people who are taxed. This is the State tax bill. The county and municipal levies will be added, in the aggregate, reach an equal sum. The profits of production, on the excess of receipts, for produce over and above the absolute expense, throughout the State, it is estimated, will no more than pay this tax. Consequently, if the tax be paid, the producers will be left without means of support for their families and employes for the ensuing year.

The policy of the carpet bag reconstruction policy is thus shown to be a ruinous almost as devastating thing. And this deplorable state of things is aggravated by the fact that salaries, jurors' fees, etc., are paid in cash, which is not convertible for taxes; and what is still worse every description of personal property is liable to the solid for taxes—agricultural implements, horses, cattle, household furniture, even beds, everything that one may possess, with none of the exceptions usual in such cases. In view of these desperate circumstances, the Governor has been called upon to suspend the collection of taxes until the meeting of the Legislature, or in the event of his want of power to do that, to call an extra session of the Legislature for the accomplishment of the object through some temporary law. But no relief will be realized probably from that source. The adventurers who control affairs are wholly dependent upon what they extort from the people in the form of taxation. The credit of the State will no longer avail them, and the bonds of the State are available in the market.

The point is well taken in the following extract from the Raleigh Carolinian: The amount of the Internal Revenue tax paid in this District for the month of October, 1871, upon the snug little sum of \$11,928.35.

And yet our member of Congress is not scared, and a Senator from N. Carolina stands out in the cold, both cases illustrating a new principle of government—Taxation without representation.

The Collector for this District, Col. I. J. Young, says the Carolinian has placed in the U. S. Depository in this city, to the credit of the United States Treasurer, since April 12, 1869, one million and two hundred dollars, being the total amount of Internal Revenue tax paid by the people of the eight counties comprising this Obnoxious District, within a period of two years and a half. And that's the way the money goes; pop goes the weasel!

The Sumter News gives credit to the colored people for their invaluable assistance at a fire at Maysville depot, by which a large amount of property was saved from destruction.

The Carolina Spartan says: The excitement in our town has somewhat subsided. No arrests have been made during the last week! Notwithstanding, the United States forces here, consisting of cavalry and infantry, were re-inforced on Friday evening last by a company of artillery.
