Revenue Tax on Tobacco.

IMPORTANT LETTER FROM THE TREASURY DEPARTMENT AT WASHINGTON:

Peddlers or Retail Dealers of Tobacco Pay a Special Tax of Five Dollars and may retail onywhere in the State.

TREASURY DEPARTMENT, OFFICE OF INTERNAL REVENUE. WASHINGTON, Oct. 28, 1871.

SIR :- In reply to your letter of Oct. 24, in relation to peddling manufactured tobacco, I have to say that a manufacpaying a special tax as a dealer in tobac-male, wanted everywhere. but he can sell only in the original and unbroken packages. He may send out an employee to peddle for him, who may sell on the same conditions as the manufacturer.

A peddler of tobacco who is not an employee of the manufacturer, and whose sales exceed \$100 per annum, is liable to a special tax as a dealer in tobacco for selling manufactured tabocco in the manner of a peddler, and such a peddler who has paid the special tax for so selling tobacco, may retail from wooden packages, packed and stamped according to law.
