New Goods for the Spring Season are beginning to arrive. The pretty weather since the snow storm has brought crowds of people upon our streets and business is becoming brisk again.

A Serenade.—A number of young men managed to work up quite a disturbance of the peace last Tuesday evening on the public square. At one time they seemed to be inevitable mischief at hand, but we are gratified to record that the timely interference of peace men restored quiet. Allango Davis, Scott Brown, Mr. Kestler, of the National Hotel, and a colored man, Alfred Tate, were put under bonds for appearance at Court.

Pretty Residences. Mr. John M. Knox and Mr. G. A. Bingham, have built very neat residences for themselves on Bank between Fulton and Jackson streets. The buildings are two-story, L shape, with piazzas, bay-windows, fancy ornaments and finished in tinted paints.

The LEON BROTHERS gave two entertainments in this place last week, which were well attended, considering the weather; and so far as we have heard, their performance were entirely satisfactory to their patrons.

The Berger Family, or Swiss Bell Ringers, were advertised to appear on Saturday night, and were on hand at the appointed hour, but three causes operated to their defeat in obtaining an audience: The Leons had preceded them by one day and had made a favorable impression; the snow lay 10 inches on the ground; and—the price of admission was a little too high.

THE SNOW STORM, which commenced here Friday night about 10 o'clock, was as great a surprise to most of our citizens as it was in itself grand. It continued all night and until about 1 1/2 o'clock on Saturday, p. m., at which time the average depth of snow was 10 inches.

An incident, as a result of this storm, and creditable to our town, was the prompt assembling of a number of citizens at McNeely's corner, Saturday afternoon, to inquire into the destitution that might exist among the poor, and to provide instant relief. The severity and suddenness of the storm, it was feared, had caught many without firewood, and probably a few without provisions. Committees were appointed to visit each ward, empowered to grant orders for supplies, so that the destitute had nothing to do but to carry the orders and obtain relief. A number of citizens volunteered wagons and teams to deliver firewood, which was generously donated by a gentleman not a resident of the place. Altogether, the work was well conceived and promptly executed. Relief was granted to some sixty or more persons, (seven-eighths of them colored) some of whom must have suffered without it.

THE DAILY NEWS. A new journal enterprise has opened at Raleigh within the last few days, which promises to be of real value to the State. The proprietors and editor of the Roanoke News have bought out the Carolina at Raleigh, and commenced a daily with the above title. They will also publish a weekly paper. Politics, democratic conservative.

IMPORTANT DECISIONS.—NORTH CAROLINA RAILROADS.—The United States Supreme Court to-day decided the following cases: Wilmington and Weldon Railroad Company vs. Reid, sheriff—error to the Supreme Court of North Carolina. In this case the court below enforced a tax recently imposed by statute upon the property of the railroad company, while by its charter, in the consideration of the construction of the road as therein specified, it was forever exempt from State taxation. This court says that however implicit it may be in the sovereign to allow the taxing power to pass out of its hands, still, when it has been done, the court will enforce the contract, the same as if it were between private parties. In this case the taxation is deemed to impair the contract of exemption made by the charter of the company, and the tax is therefore held to be illegal and the statute imposing it void. Judgment reversed.

Reid vs. Gaston Railroad Company vs. Reid—error to the Supreme Court of North Carolina. The exemption in this case was for a term of years, and it held good for the period, according to the terms of the charter. Wash. Cor. Baltimore Sun.

In reply to Mr. Morton, of Indiana, on Friday last, Mr. Trumbull said that the clause of the McKinley law authorizing the suspension of the writ of habeas corpus was plainly in violation of the Constitution.

Fire.—We learn that the big Building at Davidson College was found to be on fire last Friday morning about 11 o'clock. A defective flue was supposed to be the cause, as the fire was first seen in the roof and near a chimney. It was extinguished without much damage. Char. Democrat.
