NOTES FROM SALISBURY.—December 26th, 1872.—All hands hyperstating waiting for a thaw. Plenty of wood, Christmas turkeys and good cheer.

The health of Salisbury is excellent. Its reputation for sickness is not warranted by its mortality list or the number of its old people or the avoirdupois average of its ladies and gentlemen.

During a constant acquaintance of 12 years I have known very few instances of death from acute disease, while I have been able to glean Revolutionary stories from some of its inhabitants who remembered the far away years of much of the 18th century.

But the place has been greatly injured in reputation by the chills which abound at certain seasons of the year. If the citizens of Salisbury—the property-holders—knew just half of the terror with which the regions around regard their town on account of the malarial disease that afflicts it, they would bestir themselves to have the cause removed if possible.

We do not agree with the correspondent in what he says about our town especially the last paragraph, but give the whole as one view taken of us.
