A large and enthusiastic Convention of the Democratic-Conservative Party of Rowan co., assembled at the Court House Saturday the 16th day of May, 1874.

Upon motion of James E. Kerr, Esq., John S. Henderson, Esq., was called to the chair, and upon motion J. G. Fleming, Esq., Joseph A. Hawkins and W. M. Kincaid were elected Secretaries.

Upon a call of the roll of the different townships it was ascertained that delegates from all the townships were present and answered to their names.

Resolved (1) That we heartily endorse and approve the plan of organization, and platform of principles adopted by the Democratic-Conservative State Executive Committee.

(2) That a Convention be held in the Court House on Saturday the 6th day of June 1874 for the purpose of nominating candidates for the House of Representatives and for County officers.

(3) That the Executive Committees of the different townships be requested to hold primary meetings and send delegates.

(4) That the Chairman of this meeting appoint fifty delegates to attend the Congressional Convention to be held at Wilkesboro on the 11th day of June 1874, twenty-five delegates to attend the Judicial District Convention to be held at Winston on the 19th inst., and twenty-five delegates to attend the Senatorial Convention, which we recommended shall be held on Saturday the 13th day of June 1874 at Ford's Mills.

(5) That the Chairman and Secretaries of this Convention be added to the list of delegates to each of the above Conventions. Pending the adoption of the above resolutions able and patriotic speeches were made by James E. Kerr, Esq., and the Hon. F. E. Shober urging the necessity of a complete and perfect organization of our party, and predicting the defeat of the Republican Party in the ensuing elections.

Upon motion of Dr. Chunn the different townships were requested to hold their primary meetings on Saturday the 3rd and at the hour of 1 o'clock P. M., and select delegates to the County Convention.

The Hon. F. E. Shober moved that the Chairman appoint with the advice of the delegates from the several townships an Executive Committee for the County and also an Executive Committee for each township.

The motion was carried and the following gentlemen appointed Executive Committees for the County at large: James E. Kerr, J. J. Stewart and G. A. Bingham.
