The Southern Methodist Decreed Possess ion of their Church Property.

The Methodist Church in Greeneville, whorth about \$4,000, was sold for debt in 1857. Most of the debt was paid off within two years from day of sale. The purchaser, a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, extended the right of redemption, and received two payments after the two years from sale had expired, receiving the last payment in March, 1860. About \$80 remained unpaid. In 1866, the purchaser having left the Southern and joined the Northern Church, took a sheriff's deed for the property on the same day, for the remainder of his debt, with interest, amounting to about \$108, deeded it to the trustees for the Northern Church, some of these trustees being a part of the board of trustees that held the property for the Southern Church have gone to the Northern Church brutally whipped just after the war, dur post free. ing the reign of terror in Green county. In November, 1871, suit was instituted by the Soutbern Church, praying the Chancellor to permit them to pay one hundred and eight dollars, and to restore to them their property.
