the New York law, allowing that State to bring suit against any State that refuses to pay her bonds owned by a citizen of of New York, is to enable suits to brought on North Carolina special tax bonds. We therefore have a direct and immediate interest in the decision of this ense. Should the court decide in favor of the plaintiff, it will not be long before a similar proceeding will be begun against North Carolina. We, however, do not anticipate such a decision. The object of the clause in the constitution allowing Genuine Porus Plaster. suits between States was to prevent the necessity of a resort to arms to settle differences arising among the States. The Jurisdiction of the court does not extend to cases of this nature, and inasmuch as a citizen of one State cannot sue another State in the Supreme Court, it would be an evasion to permit his State to prosecute his suit which he himself is debarred from prosecuting. But should the Supreme Court decide otherwise and give a judgment in favor of New York against Louisians or North Carolina, the very interesting question should arise as to how the judgment is to be satisfied. Suppose New York should recover a judgment of twelve million dollars against North Carolina: What of it? How is that judgment to be collected? It may be thought that under the clause that "no State shall without the consent of Congress engage in war," Congress might give consent for New York to go to war to collect her debt, but then sections 4 of article 14 would seem to prohibit such consent from being given, for there it is declared that the United States shall protect each State against invasion. It seems that all the defendant in this case would have to do in case of an adverse judgment, would be to remain quiescent. The judgment is incapable of enforcement. We, therefore, anticipate that the suit

### Packing the Juries.

We ask the people of the United States whose sense of justice is rarely if ever obscured, whether they approve of packing juries to secure convictions, even when the offenses charged relate to elections and the defendants are white men and South Carolinians? This is what is done in the United States Court in Charleston at the present term. It was done yesterday. And if a conviction de not follow, irrespective of the weight of evidence and the naked facts, the fault is not with the District-Attorney. The jury box is stuffed, because the persons on trial are accused of stuffing the ballot

The District-Attorney has the right, under the law, to challenge three juror permptorily, and can reject any juro who is shown on examination, to be pre judiced or to have formed an opinion on the case. In addition to this, the district Attorney claims the right to reject, at his will and pleasure, every juror who does not suit him. By this process, he rejected twelve respectable white men yesterday whose only disability was their good character and the color of their skin. Only the week before last, when Kane was on trial for murder, Judge Bond, who was on the bench with Cheif Justice Waite, in the Ellenten trials, ruled that the prosecutions could not reject jurors by standing them aside. In the Sumter case yesterday, as in the Acton case last week, the District-Attorney was allowed, neverthepower on earth to prevent him from packing the jury. It has been done.

We know that South Carolina is unde the ban, and that the stalwarts, havin given us a bad name, consider us fit sub jects for confinement in the penitentiary But a fair trial by an impartial jury denied the defendants in the political case in Charleston, and we are absolute ly without remedy.
