

> "In fattening swine they often reach a point where corn fails to satisfy, but little corn is consumed and the hogs do not increase in weight. The trouble is that the corn is too hard for fattening. Then try soak ing it for twenty-four hours before feeding. This is cheaper than grinding and cooking, and it is claimed to be better for fattening swine. In soaking corn it develops a sweetness simi lar to that found in green corn and called gluclose. Corn in this state is much relished, and is very futtening In a dry state this sweetness remains undeveloped."

CLOSE CORN .- In the culture of corn, where planting is confined to distances not exceeding two, to two and a half feet between the rows and hills, the corn thrives better and suffers less from drought than where the distances are four fect. One main reason why corn grown so closely is superior in growth is because the ground is shaded and evaporation prevented, the plant acting to a certain extent the part of a mulch. One reason why the frequent use of the cultivator is so highly beneficial in because it breaks up the continuous capillary tubes in the ground that facilitate the evaporation of moisture and transforms the upper layer of soil into a sort of loose mulch.-Western Agriculturist.
