New York, March 18.—The anniversary of the Paris Commune of 1871 was celebrated by the Communists of this city to-day, in Concordia Hall.

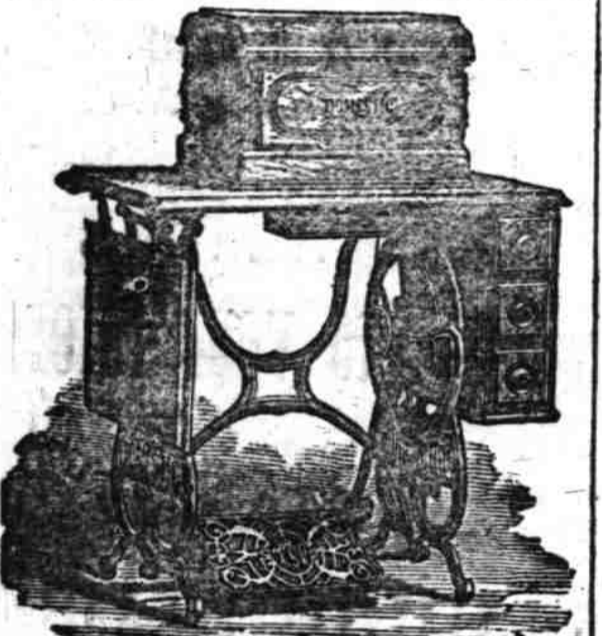

Deep or Sub-Soil Ploughing.

BY A. S. HEATH, M. D. Deep ploughing is not always and invariably desirable in all soils. Where twenty inches below the surface there is a thin crust and beneath it a deep gravel bed or sand stratum, to break through this would be virtually to knock the bottom out of your land.

Deep ploughing in a sub-soil of cold, damp iron is ruinous always. But when the soil is deep and the sub-soil compact and holds water to the detriment of the crops grown, and where shallow soil dries up in hot weather, deep ploughing is undoubtedly a highly beneficial process.

Theoretically alone, it is not safe to base calculations of profit upon ploughing. Practical experiments are too valuable in results to be left out of your calculations.

Experiments have demonstrated on a small field, that fifteen inch ploughing increased the crops over eight inch ploughing—of turnips six tons, of barley seven bushels, and of potatoes nearly a ton.

The advocates of superficial ploughing often deny that the soil has been manured, yet it is found that it is left to rest in grass for a number of years, and grazed at that, so that in fact the droppings of stock and the thick carpet or mat of grass roots do actually and richly manure the fields where these are turned under by the plough, however superficially ploughed.
