Deep or Sub-Soil Ploughing.

BY A. S. HEATH, M. D.

Deep ploughing is not always and invariably desirable in all soils Where twenty inches below the surface there is a thin crust and beneath it a deep gravel bed or sand stratum. to break through this would be virtually to knock the bottom out of your land, and let all your manure, fert. lizers and plant food in the soil filter through it. This would be as sensible as milking into a seive, or attempting to carry water in a bottomless pail.

Deep ploughing in a sub-soil of cold, damp iron is ruinous always. But when the soil is deep and the sub-soil compact and holds water to the detriment of the crops grown, and where shallow soil dries up in hot weather, deep ploughing is undoubtedly a highly beneficial pro-

Deep ploughing acts beneficially in dry soils as well as in wet soils. where it is at all admissible. For in one case it permits the water laden with inorganic matters to reach the roots and elevate the drama. of the plants, and in the other it permits deeper evaporation to carry off breaks the crust so that hurtful stagnant water may escape; it is, in other words, a most useful kind of cheap drain.
