## Cabbage,

A writer in the Homestead, of Pottonville, Iowa, says: "The prevailing custom of raising cabbage plants in a hotbed or frame, and afterward transplanting them is a mistake. We have experimented for several years, using both modes, and invariably get the best results from planting the seed in the hills where we wish them to grow; planting three or four seed in each hill and thinning them out after they show plants.
