On account of the rather too early call for the judicial and congressional conventions, which our county convention, of necessity, must auto-date, the latter was set for July 20th, and the primaries for July 14th.

So that, be it remembered, the primaries are set for JULY 14th, and the convention JULY 20th.

MANNER OF HOLDING PRIMARIES.

1st. The unit of the convention will be the unit of the precinct, and not the township. So that on the call of the roll, where a township has more than one voting place, each voting place will vote its own strength.

The same rules will hold good for Salisbury township, except that the polls shall close at 6 o'clock instead of 5.

NOTE HOW REPORTED TO THE COUNTY CONVENTION.

Said poll holders or judges of election, together with such delegates as the primaries may elect, shall report the vote of their respective precincts to, and cast it in the county convention.

FOR WHOM VOTE COUNTED.

The unit of the convention shall be the unit of the precinct. The candidate receiving a clear majority of the vote of a precinct shall be entitled to the whole strength of such precinct.

DELEGATES.

Each precinct shall elect its own delegates, and may do so by ballot or otherwise.

APPOINTMENT OF POLL HOLDERS.

That it shall be the duty of each member of the Democratic Executive Committee to appoint three poll holders or judges of election for his respective precinct.

Summer Figs.

No effort is made, says Farm and Home, to secure a lot of summer pigs usually. There is a feeling with breeders and farmers that they will not do well during hot weather - that there is danger of the sows dying at farrowing time and that the pigs will perish from heat.

If through losses of March or earlier farrowing we have sows that can be bred for summer litter we do not hesitate on account of prospective heat, but when farrowing time comes we are careful to know that the sows have an abundance of shade, with pure, clear water, and clean wallows in reach.

It is a good plan to start a young sow with a summer litter. This will give her time to regain the strength lost in suckling before time to breed for a spring litter.
